January is National Braille Literacy Month. After being blinded in an accident, Louis Braille developed the tactile reading system in 1824, at the age of 15. He based it on French Captain Charles Barbier de la Sarré's military deciphering code that had been used by soldiers communicating at night, silently and without light.
