4 Don Wood was born in California on May 4th, 1945. Growing up on a farm, he worked long hours in the summer and had time to draw during the winter. By 6th grade he decided he wanted to be an artist. He and his wife co-wrote popular children's titles and Wood illustrated many of his wife's stories. Wood is known for The Napping House, as well as The Little Mouse, The Red Ripe Strawberry, and The Big Hungry Bear. As an illustrator, he won the Caldecotte medal for the book King Bidgood's in the Bathtub.

12 Florence Nightingale was born in Florence, Italy on May 12, 1820. Considered the founder of modern nursing procedures, she brought innovation and recognition to nursing as a profession. A strong advocate of public health, Nightingale spoke three languages: French, German, and Italian. She also loved cats! Over the course of her life, she shared her home with sixty cats!

13 Stevie Wonder was born Stevland Hardaway Judkins on May 13, 1950, in Saginaw, MI. He lost his eyesight shortly after birth; however, he was so talented that he became a celebrated musical performer. At the age of 13, Wonder was the youngest artist ever to have a top recording. He won many awards, more than any other male solo artist. In 2014 President Barack Obama awarded Stevie Wonder with the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

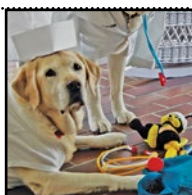
23 Margaret Wise Brown was an author and editor. She began her career as a teacher in New York City, but within a few years she was writing books for children. Her stories were told through the eyes of children and she was once quoted as saying she wrote her books "to amuse and delight and comfort small children." She is best known for writing Goodnight Moon and Runaway Bunny.

26 Dr. Sally Ride, an astronaut and physicist, was born on May 26, 1951. In 1983 she became the youngest American and the first American woman to go into space. After retiring from NASA, Dr. Ride advocated for improved math and science education (especially for girls). She also co-wrote seven science books for children, and in 2001 she founded [Sally Ride Science](#) @UC San Diego, with the goal of making learning about math and science fun.
