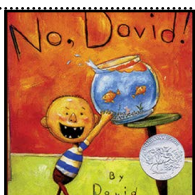

While he is most well-known as a poet, Cummings was also a painter and wrote novels, essays, and plays, as well.

26 Steven Kellogg was born in Norwalk, CT in 1941. He loved books and began to write and draw when he was very young. Kellogg also loved animals. He enjoyed putting them in his books. His well-known Pinkerton book series is based on the Kellogg family dog, the real-life Pinkerton.

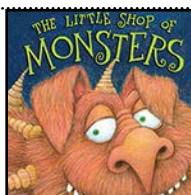
