Making a Simple Solar Oven

Dad and Danny cook marshmallows on an open fire in the chapter book **Camping Out**. Another way to safely make toasted marshmallows is in a solar oven that you can make yourself with common household items. The project should take only about 15 minutes.

Materials You Will Need:

A box with hinged lid (A shoe box or pizza box will work well.)

Aluminum foil

A sheet of black construction paper

Plastic wrap

Tape or glue

A stick (straw, pencil or wooden skewer)

An aluminum pan or tray (You can make your own with foil.)

Marshmallows (chocolate and graham crackers are optional.)



- 1. Use tape and foil to line the entire inside of the box (shiny side facing out).
- 2. Attach a half sheet of black construction paper to the floor of the box.



3. Place the stick upright inside the top of the box lid to prop the lid open and secure it with a piece of tape. The bottom of the stick should rest outside the box

To Make Roasted Beans or Corn Kernels, follow the easy directions below:

- Preheat the oven to 400° F.
- · Dry cooked black beans, chickpeas, or rinsed frozen corn on paper towels.
- · Toss them with olive oil and salt... or try another seasoning.
- · Spread the beans, chickpeas or corn out, in one layer, on a parchment covered baking sheet.
- Roast them for 15-20 minutes. Store leftovers in an airtight container for 2-3 days.
