	Take away the dy at the end. The part of a plant that grows into a leaf or a flower.
	Change the b to m at the beginning. A mixture of dirt and water; pigs roll in this to keep cool.
	Change the u to a in the middle. The opposite of glad; rhymes with sad.
	Change the d to p at the end. Norman and Danny followed this to get to the park.
	Change the a to o in the middle. What is used to clean the floor.
	Change the m to c at the beginning. Another word for a policeman or policewoman.
	Change the o to u in the middle. This holds juice or milk.
III	Take away the letter c at the beginning. The opposite of down.

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
